## 01 Community/Agency Partnerships

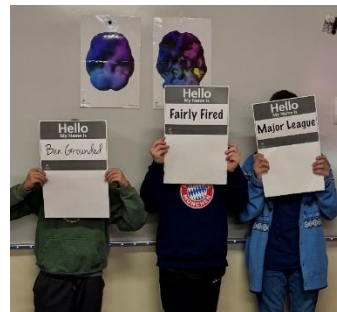
During the months of January and February, Dunbarton Police Officers participated in or continued the following community/agency partnerships and/or events:

During January and February, our **Law Enforcement Against Drugs (LEAD) Program** at the Dunbarton Elementary School covered the following lessons:

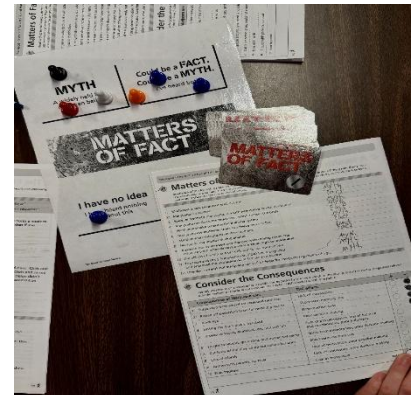
**Lesson 7 – Effects of Nicotine Use:** Students learned about the short-term, long-term, and social consequences of using nicotine and tobacco products.



**Lesson 8 – Effects of THC and Marijuana Use:** Students learned the effects of marijuana on the teenage brain and body.

**Lesson 9 – Safe Use of Prescription and Over-the-Counter Medicines:** Students learned to differentiate the safe and unsafe use of prescription and over-the-counter medicines.

**Lesson 10 – Street Drugs and Course Review:** Students learned the harmful effects of street drugs, as well as the benefits of remaining health and drug free.





We are pleased to announce that the entire 6th grade class at the Dunbarton Elementary School ("DES") graduated the Law Enforcement Against Drugs' ("LEAD") Too Good for Drugs (TGF) course in February! Each student was presented with a graduation certificate, followed by plenty of baked goods to enjoy. Many thanks to DES and 6th grade faculty and staff for their continued support of this program! LEAD is an evidence-based drug and violence prevention program that promotes effective decision-making skills, goal setting, and positive relationships. LEAD was introduced to 6th grade students at DES starting with the 2021-2022 school year. To date, over 200 students have graduated from this 10-week program. Receive an alert and follow the directions given. Early notification is key to saving lives and property during disasters.

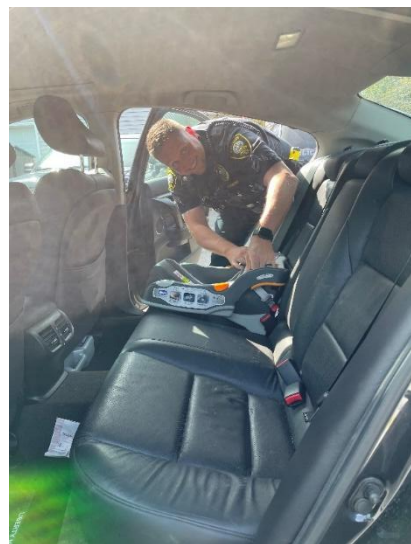

In an effort to enhance emergency preparedness and communication, the Town of Dunbarton has gone live with the **Genasys Alert Notification System**. Individuals can opt-in to receive emergency alerts for incidents such as missing children or vulnerable adults, threats to public safety, or severe weather events that lead to widespread power outages, road flooding, etc. To register, please visit this [link](#). A highly visible and public location for these exchanges eliminates the need to meet at a private residence and reduces the overall risk of victimization and crime.



The Dunbarton Police Department is pleased to offer a new community policing program: **Project Good Morning!** Project Good Morning is a program designed to assist community residents who do not have regular daily contact with relatives, friends or neighbors.

The program allows for residents to make scheduled contact with the Dunbarton Police Department to ensure that they are OK, and further allowing for their independence and ability to stay in their homes. This program allows family, friends and neighbors the security of knowing the enrolled individual is having regular daily contact with someone. 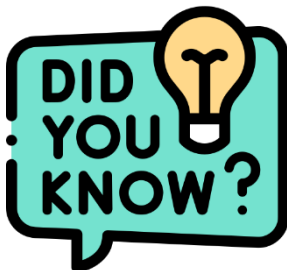

The State of New Hampshire recently implemented a **Contact Person Notification Program**. This is a statewide public safety initiative that allows residents to voluntarily provide contact information of a legal guardian or other individual who can assist law enforcement in communicating with persons with cognitive impairment or other disabilities.
