BLUE ENVELOPE PROGRAM

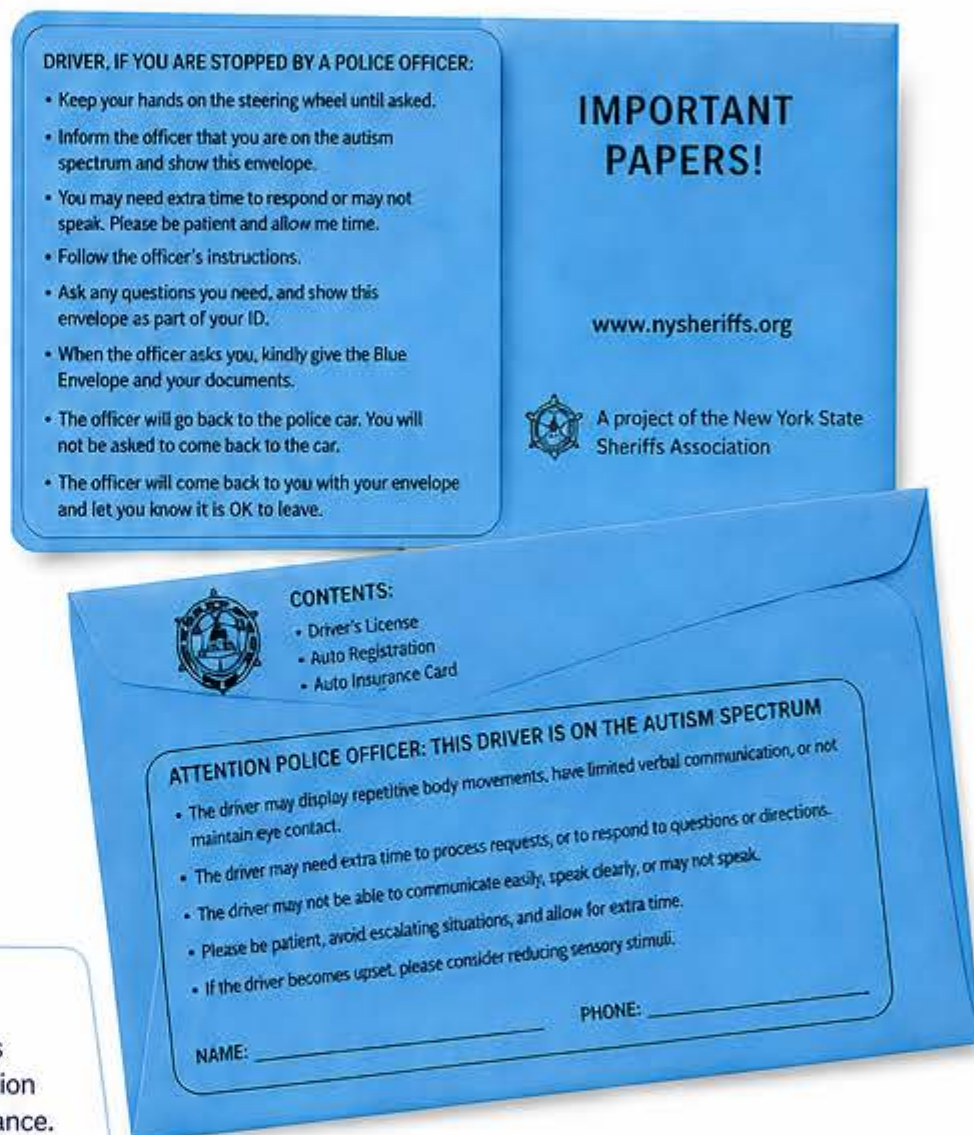


The City of Corning Police Department is **proud to collaborate with the New York State Sheriffs Association** and offer the Blue Envelope Program.

The Blue Envelope Program is designed to support safe, clear communication between law enforcement and drivers with autism.

Participants receive a blue envelope to keep important documents in one easy-to-access place inside their vehicle.

Participation is **voluntary** and **confidential**. The City of Corning Police Department **does not** maintain a database of participants in the program.



WHAT IS THE PURPOSE?

The Blue Envelope alerts law enforcement and first responders that a driver may be on the autism spectrum before an interaction begins—such as during a traffic stop, crash, or roadside assistance.

It also:

- ✓ Provides guidance for both the driver and the responding officer
- ✓ Keeps important documents organized in one place
- ✓ Helps reduce stress and improve communication during interactions



WHAT SHOULD I KEEP IN MY BLUE ENVELOPE?

You can store:



Photo ID



Vehicle registration



Proof of insurance



Emergency contact information

Keep the envelope in an easy-to-reach location, such as your **glove compartment or center console**.



WILL THIS PREVENT ME FROM GETTING A TICKET?

No. Participation in the program does not exempt drivers from traffic laws or citations.



DO I NEED TO PROVIDE MEDICAL INFORMATION?

No. You are not required to provide any medical information to receive a Blue Envelope.
