

**A PUBLIC MEETING
YORK COUNTY REGIONAL POLICE COMMISSION
JUNE 17, 2026**

A public meeting of the York County Regional Police Commission was held on Wednesday, June 17, 2026, at the York County Regional Police Department, 33 Oak St., York, PA 17402.

Those present were Kathy Kerchner, Commissioner, David Naylor, Commissioner, Anne Gray, Commissioner, Robert Kessler, Commissioner, Paul Knepper, Commissioner, Andrew Herrold, Commissioner, Darryl Albright, Commissioner, Timothy Damon, Chief of Police, Peter Ruth, Solicitor, and Angela Longnecker, Business Administrator.

Commissioner Kerchner called the meeting to order at 6:01 pm.

Pledge of Allegiance.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Commissioner Kerchner informed the public that in accordance with the Commission's policy on public comment, they will need to be a taxpayer or resident in one of the participating municipalities to make a comment. There will be a three-minute maximum time limit for each person speaking, and a one-hour time limit for public comment. Anyone commenting will need to come to the lector and state their name and address. At this time there were two comments made by citizens regarding the 287(g) MOA that was signed on March 18, 2026.

CONTRACTING MUNICIPALITIES' COMMENTS

Commissioner Kerchner asked the Contracting Municipalities if they had any comments regarding police services.

DALLASTOWN BOROUGH – No comments.

JACOBUS BOROUGH – No comments.

MANCHESTER BOROUGH – Mayor Vance thanked everyone for helping her with questions while she is transitioning into her position.

MT. WOLF BOROUGH – Mayor Parish thanked the Department for helping with Chestnut Street. Mayor Parish stated that there are issues on Rt. 24 with speeding coming into the Borough, the speed signs have helped.

SPRING GROVE BOROUGH – Mayor Abbott stated the Borough will be holding a 250th celebration on July 4th, 2026.

YOE BOROUGH – No comments.

APPROVAL OR AMENDMENTS TO MINUTES OF May 20, 2026

Commissioner Kerchner asked for a motion to approve the minutes of May 20, 2026.

CORRESPONDENCE/COMMUNICATIONS

There were two citizen comments this month complimenting Officer George and Officer Rivera, thanking them for their help.

FINANCIAL REPORT

Grants – There was nothing to report.

Monthly Report – Angela Longnecker informed the Commissioners the department received a check from Spring Garden Township for reimbursement of a workers compensation claim. Angela

Longnecker also stated the department received sixty percent of the surplus distribution for health insurance from Intergovernmental Insurance. Three vehicles were purchased from Koch Ford. A reimbursement check was received from EMC Insurance for the total loss of vehicle number twenty-two.

Approval of Expenses for May 1, 2026 through May 31, 2026 - \$1,707,817.79.

Commissioner Kerchner asked for a motion to approve the expenses for May 1, 2026, through May 31, 2026, in the amount of \$ 1,707,817.79. A motion to approve the expenses was made by Commissioner Naylor, seconded by Commissioner Gray, motion carried.

Approval of General Reserve Fund Expenses for May 1, 2026 through May 31, 2026 - \$44,925.00.

Commissioner Kerchner asked for a motion to approve the expenses for the General Reserve Fund for May 1, 2026, through May 31, 2026, in the amount of \$44,925.00. A motion to approve the expenses was made by Commissioner Kessler, seconded by Commissioner Gray, motion carried.

Approval of Post Employment Healthcare Fund Expenses for May 1, 2026 through May 31, 2026 - \$47,000.00.

Commissioner Kerchner asked for a motion to approve the expenses for the Post Employment Healthcare Fund for May 1, 2026, through May 31, 2026, in the amount of \$47,000.00. A motion to approve the expenses was made by Commissioner Gray, seconded by Commissioner Naylor, motion carried.

SOLICITOR'S REPORT

Approval of sale of 2017 EBY Horse Trailer

Attorney Ruth stated that two bids were received for the 2017 EBY horse trailer. The first bid was received from Hanna Saucy for \$10,500.00. The second bid was received from Lisica Farm, LLC for \$ 35,621.00. Attorney Ruth stated that neither bid met the reserve. After discussion it was decided to award the bid to Lisica Farm, LLC, and to have the Friends of York County Regional Mounted Police Nonprofit fund the difference in the reserve and the amount awarded. A motion to approve the bid from Lisica Farm LLC in the amount of \$ 35,621.00, with the Friends of York County Regional Mounted Police nonprofit making up the difference in the reserve and the awarded amount was made by Commissioner Kerchner, seconded by Commissioner Naylor, motion carried.

POLICE CHIEF'S REPORT

Chief Damon reviewed the three vehicle equipment quotes for upfitting vehicle numbers fifty-five, fifty-six and fifty-seven. Each quote is for \$8,641.09. Commissioner Kerchner asked for a motion to approve the three quotes for vehicle upfits. A motion to approve the quotes for three vehicle upfits each quote of \$ 8,641.09 was made by Commissioner Gray, seconded by Commissioner Kessler, motion carried.

Approval of General Order 03-71 Police Motorcycle Operations/Motorcycle Unit

Commissioner Kessler made a motion to approve General Order 03-71 Police Motorcycle Operations/Motorcycle Unit, seconded by Commissioner Naylor, motion carried.

Approval of General Order 05-72 Fire Investigations Unit

Commissioner Naylor made a motion to approve General Order 05-72 Fire Investigations Unit, seconded by Commissioner Gray, motion carried.

Approval of MOU for Office on Violence Against Women Cyber Crimes Grant Application

Commissioner Kercher asked for a motion to approve the MOU for Office on Violence Against Women Cyber Crimes Grant Application with Chief Damon being the signer. Commissioner Gray made a motion to approve the MOU on Violence Against Women Cyber Crimes Grant Application, and approval for Chief Damon to be the signer for York County Regional Police Department, seconded by Commissioner Kessler, motion carried.

Chief Damon discussed that a new vendor has come in to review our property and casualty insurance and has given a proposal to possibly save the department money on our renewals. Chief Damon discussed that we also met with our current insurance broker and gave them notice that another broker is interested in providing service. Discussion was had on what we can do to possibly find the same coverage at a better rate.

Chief Damon reviewed the activities for the month.

Chief Damon gave an update on grants.

COMMISSIONER'S COMMENTS

Commissioner Albright had no comments.

Commissioner Herrold commended Chief for attending one of the shortest meetings at Spring Garden Township last week.

Commissioner Knepper stated the building expansion was approved at the York Township Meeting.

Commissioner Kessler wished everyone a Happy and Safe July 4th.

Commissioner Naylor said congratulations to Officer George and Officer Rivera.

Commissioner Kerchner wished everyone a happy and safe day on July 4th. Commissioner Kerchner also asked how the department is making out with the new law regarding cell phones.

Commissioner Gray thanked Chief for attending the township meeting, and for the Officers who followed up on the complaint at the meeting. Commissioner Gray also reminded everyone that Friday will be Juneteenth and wished everyone a Happy July 4th.

Commissioner Kerchner made a motion to recess to executive session at 6:37pm.

The Commission reconvened at 6:50pm.

Commissioner Kerchner asked for a motion to adjourn the meeting. A motion to adjourn the meeting was made by Commissioner Naylor at 6:50pm, seconded by Commissioner Gray, motion carried.
