May 27th: SRO Cole meet with parents of students with special needs to discuss safety protocol and answer general topics.

May 4th: Officers completed Spring firearms qualification and low light shooting training.



May 7th: Chief Hook, Patrol Sergeant Doelp, and Police Administrative Assistant Keener met with an SHT grant writer to discuss grant application opportunities for the SHPD.

May 7th: Chief Hook and SRO Cole attended the quarterly crisis meeting at CWSD. This is a quarterly meeting between first responders and school leadership to discuss and coordinate responses to emergencies.

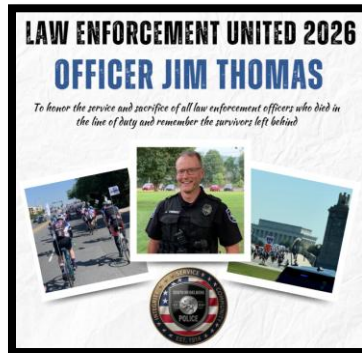
May 11th: Sgt. Doelp attended the board meeting for the Conrad Soccer Association to discuss an incident involving a fight between parents that occurred at a game.

May 18th: Hosted a ride-along for a potential police cadet.

May 23rd: Hosted a ride-along for the police cadet.

Community Relations:

May 10th-12th: Officer Thomas attended the United Law Enforcement Ride. This year members of ULE from all divisions raised enough money to give \$120,000 for the officer down memorial page, \$340,000 to the COPS camp, \$220,000 for Spirit of the Blue, and \$31,000 for mental health and suicide prevention.



May 16th: Officer Cole assisted the 1st Annual Read, Run 5K for the Robesonia Library. SHPD provided traffic cones, traffic control, and security for the event.



Youth Outreach: On **May 24th**, Officer Dougherty participated in a rewards initiative at Conrad Weiser East Elementary. Approximately 20 students redeemed positive behavior tokens for snacks and games with the officer.



May 11th and 12th: Sgt. Doelp and Officer Baxter met with students of the Little People's Nursery, spoke about safety topics, and answered the students' questions.

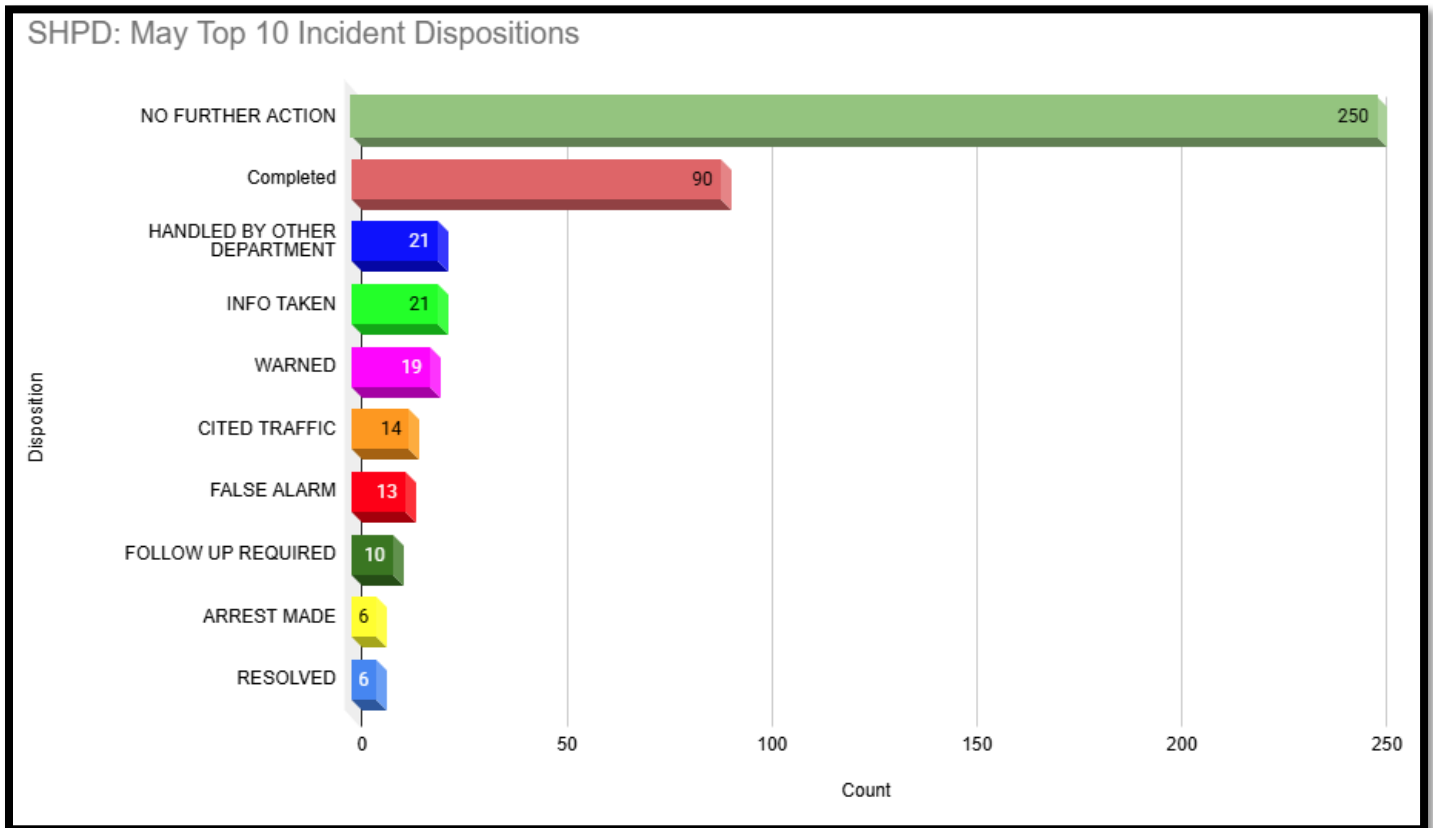
May 21st: SHPD provided traffic control and security for the Patriotic Order Sons of America memorial event at Robesonia Memorial Park in Robesonia Borough.

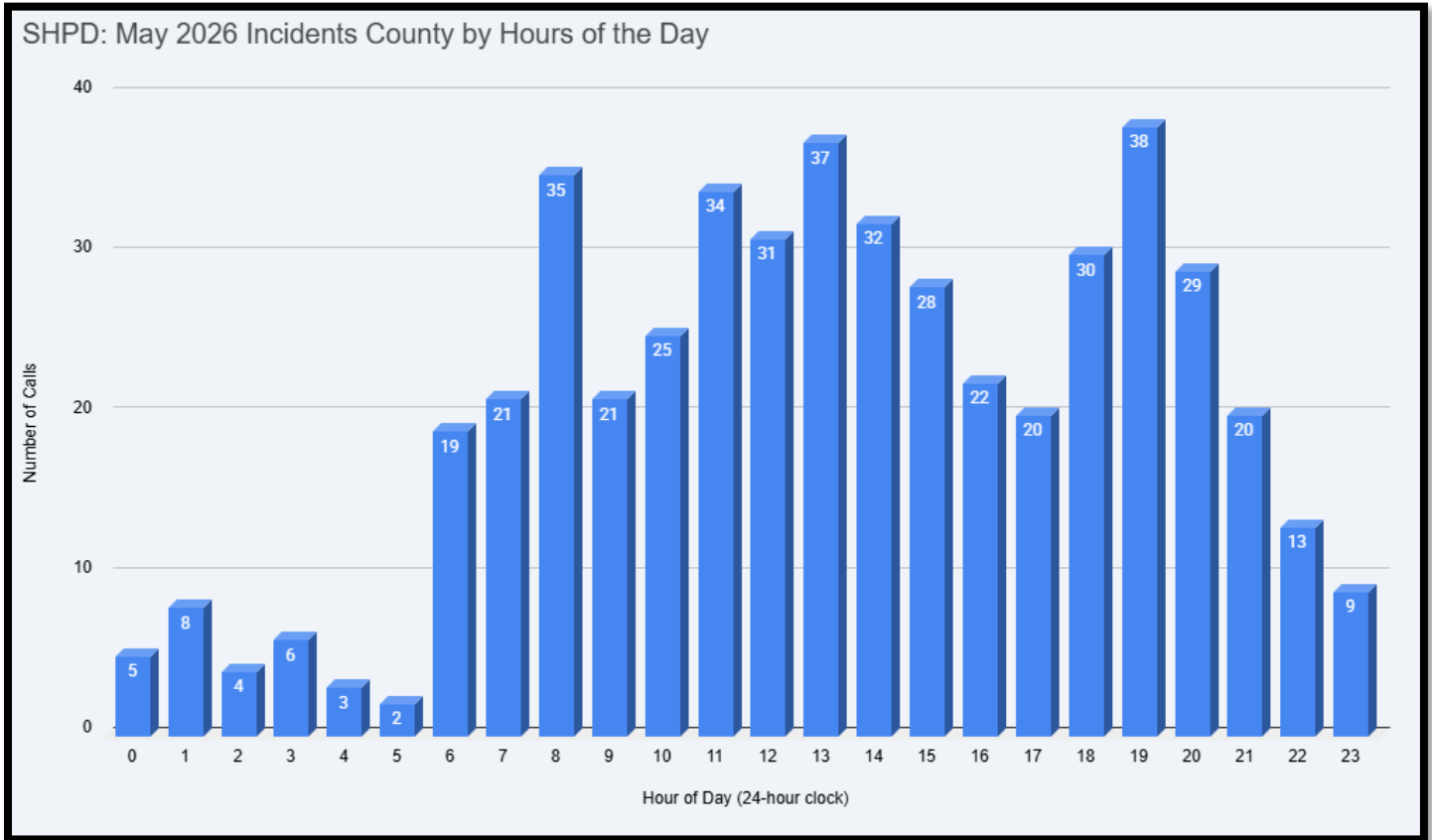
SHPD May2026 TOP 10 Calls for Service Dispositions
