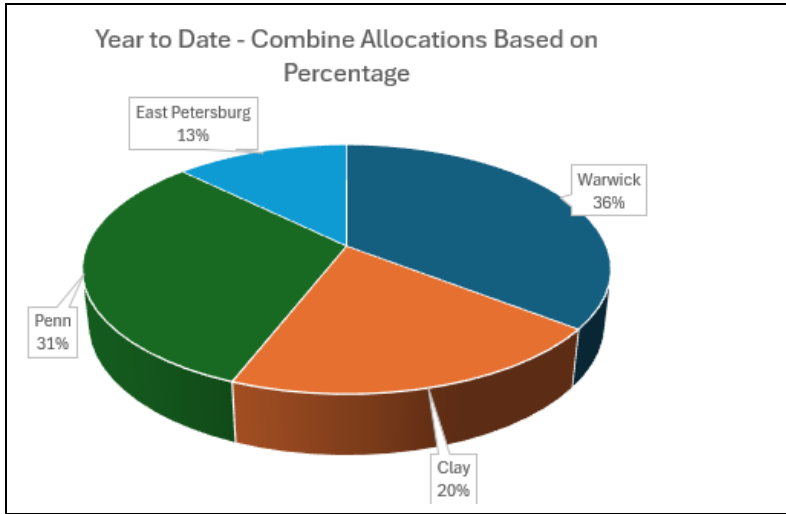

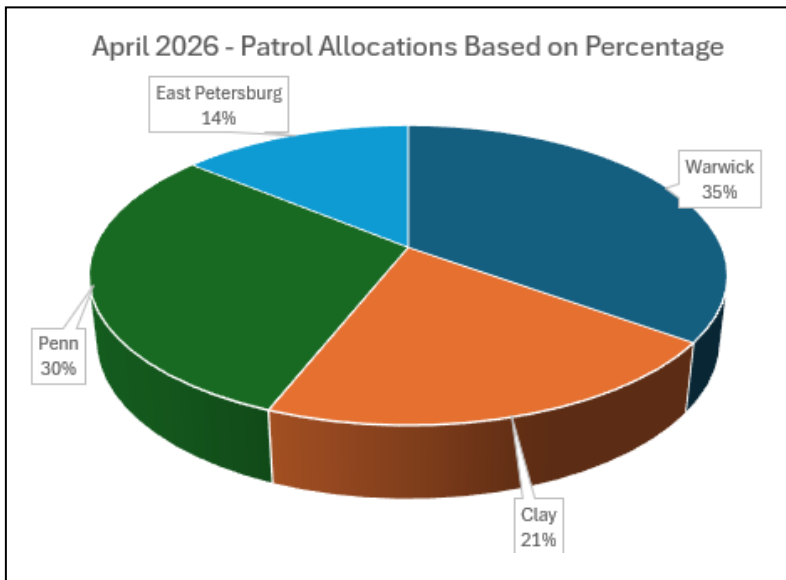

UCR - Unified Crime Reporting - The FBI's Uniform Crime Reporting program is a national statistical effort of more than 18,000 city, county, state, tribal, university, and federal law enforcement agencies that provide mandated reporting data on crime. There are two parts to UCR data collection.

- **PART I:** Offenses that include murder, rape, aggravated assault, robbery, burglary, larceny, motor vehicle theft, arson, human trafficking, and commercial-associated sex acts.
- **PART II:** Offenses that include assault, curfew violations, loitering, embezzlement, forgery, counterfeiting, disorderly conduct, DUI, drug offenses, liquor offenses, offenses against the family, prostitution, public drunkenness, runaways, certain sex offenses, and others.

VEHICLE ACCIDENTS - Vehicle accidents are a common part of patrol-related activity. Most vehicle accidents are often preventable and attributed to driver error. However, there are times when the roadway, the vehicle, or environmental issues contribute to accidents investigated. By tracking accident and causation data the NLCRPD can potentially recognize trends and offer solutions to mitigate or prevent accidents from occurring.

Accidents are generally divided into two categories.

- **“Reportable”** crashes occur when an occupant has sustained an injury, or the vehicle has become disabled and requires towing. Drivers are required to notify the police when this occurs, and the police are required to complete an investigation. PennDOT will generally only look at reportable crash data when conducting surveys or conducting evaluations for roadway safety. All Fatal accidents are reportable accidents.
- **“Non-reportable”** crashes occur when no injury has been sustained by an occupant in the car and both vehicles can be safely driven from the scene. Law requires operators to exchange information however an official police investigation is not required unless a vehicle driver or owner requests police to do so. The NLCRPD does complete reporting on all accidents.
- **“Private Property”** crashes are NOT investigated by the NLCRPD. “Private property” is defined as property where the public is generally prohibited from traveling if not invited. This can include residential driveways and certain parking areas. The agency will however document incidents in regular police reporting.

TRAFFIC STOPS & ENFORCEMENT- An important part of regular patrol activity, traffic stops are intended to increase traffic safety and minimize crashes and injuries. Note: Often violations can be observed within the NLCRPD jurisdiction, but the actual traffic stop can occur outside of NLCRPD jurisdictional boundaries.

Not every traffic stop results in a citation. An officer's critical thinking skills and discretion in any given scenario are critical. Officers are relied upon to enforce the laws of the Commonwealth however certain situations may warrant written and or verbal warnings to obtain the most effective or desired outcome.

BUSINESS CHECKS - Regular business checks and officer presence are normal, daily functions of the patrol division. Though Officers are available and present 24/7, they often record location-specific checks throughout the NLCPRD area.
